General Revenue

General Revenue collections for May totaled \$380,898,441, **exceeding** the monthly estimate of \$334,513,000 by \$46,385,441. Bringing the total year to date General Revenue collections to \$4,278,341,015.

Fiscal Year 2019 YTD Performance Exceeding estimates by **\$81,037,015**



As of the end of May the state has collected 92% of its total estimated yearly revenue of \$4,650,158,000. At this time, the state should have collected 90% of its yearly revenue. This current trend puts the state **on track** for meeting yearly revenue estimates. The Governor has increased General Revenue estimates by a total of \$210,235,000 this year. The unadjusted total YTD collections for the State would be \$291,272,015 above the Governors original FY 2019 estimate.

Personal Income Tax

Personal income tax (PIT) collections for the month were \$156,245,524. This figure is \$25,845,524 **above** the May estimate of \$130,400,000. The total year to date personal income tax collections for fiscal year 2019 are \$1,896,326,027.

Fiscal Year 2019 PIT YTD Performance Exceeding estimates by \$40,626,027



As of the end of May the state has collected 92% of its total estimated PIT yearly collections of \$2,004,000,000. At this time the state should have collected 90% of its PIT yearly collections. This current trend puts the state **on track** for meeting the PIT yearly collections estimate. On January 9, 2019 the Governor increased the yearly Personal Income Tax estimate by \$50,000,000.

Severance Tax

Severance tax collections for May were \$43,405,100. This figure is \$6,205,100 **above** the monthly estimate of \$37,200,000. Total severance tax collections for fiscal year 2019 are \$410,590,690.

Fiscal Year 2019 Severance Tax YTD Performance Exceeding estimates by **\$8,190,690**



As of the end of May the state has collected 93% of its total yearly collections of \$361,7000,000. At this time the state should have collected 91% of its yearly severance tax collections. This current trend puts the state **on track** for meeting the yearly severance tax collection estimate. On January 9, 2019 the Governor increased the yearly Severance Tax estimate by \$57,000,000.

Other Notable Collections

Consumer Sales and Service Tax collections for the month were \$599,638 **above** the May estimate of \$116,200,000 at \$116,799,638.

Tobacco Products Tax collections for May were \$18,088,335. These collections were **above** the monthly estimate of \$15,600,000 by \$2,488,335.

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May 'At A Glance'

This packet contains a monthly 'At A Glance' report of collections that, a collections report for the month of May, the second month of the fourth quarter of Fiscal Year 2019, a Fiscal Year 2019 Monthly Estimates report and the Rainy Day Fund Balance It also contains a detailed explanation of May collections from the Department of Revenue.

The 'At A Glance' report provides an overall view of monthly collections by source versus Fiscal Year to Date collections and includes comparisons of the previous fiscal year collections as well as a running total of the Rainy Day Fund.

\$46.3M *ABOVE* ESTIMATE

May 2019 collections of \$380,898,441 were <u>above</u> estimate by \$46,385,441 bringing the total fiscal year to date collections of General Revenue to \$81,037,015* <u>above</u> estimate for the 2019 Fiscal Year.

*The Governor has increased General Revenue estimates by a total of \$210,235,000.The unadjusted total YTD collections For the state would be\$291.272.015 above the Governor's

FY 2019 Fiscal Year-to-Date



May General Revenue Fund collections of \$380,898,441 were *above* the May estimate by 46,385,441 at month end (May Estimate \$334,513,000).

As of May 31, 2019 the 2019 Fiscal Year-to-date collections ended *above* the fiscal year-to-date estimate by \$81,037,015.

- The Fiscal Year 2019 Estimate (July 1, 2018 June 30, 2019) is \$4,650,185,000.
- The 2019 Fiscal Year-to-date Estimate (July 1, 2018 May 31, 2019) is \$4,197,304,000.
- Total fiscal year-to-date collections of \$4,278,341,015 are \$81,037,015, *above* at the end of May.

SEVERANCE TAXES

- May 2019 Severance Tax collections were \$6,205,100 <u>above</u> the May estimate of \$37,200,000 at \$43,405,100.
- Severance Tax Fiscal Year-to-date collections are now <u>above</u> estimate by \$8,190,690.

PERSONAL INCOME TAXES

- Personal Income Tax collections were <u>above</u> the May estimate of \$130,400,000 at \$156,245,524 for the month.
- Personal Income Tax fiscal year-to-date collections are now <u>above</u> estimate by \$40,626,027.

FY 2019 Monthly Collections vs. Estimate



- July Collections were roughly flat to estimate
- August Collections were \$5.3 Million above estimate
- **September** Collections were \$14.7 Million above estimate
- October Collections were roughly flat to estimate
- November Collections were \$2.2 Million below estimate
- December Collections were \$7.3 Million above estimate

- January Collections were \$6.1 Million below estimate
- February Collections were \$9.0 Million above estimate
- March Collections were \$3.0 Million below estimate
- *April* Collections were \$53.6 Million above estimate
- May Collections were \$46.3 Million above estimates

RAINY DAY FUNDS

[Current statute allows the Governor until October 31 each year, to borrow up to one and one-half percent of the General Revenue estimate for the fiscal year in which the funds are to be borrowed (FY2019), or the amount the Governor determines is necessary to make timely payment of the state's obligations, whichever is less. Any funds borrowed are repaid, without interest, and redeposited to the credit of the Revenue Shortfall Reserve Fund (Rainy Day Fund) within ninety days.] The Governor borrowed from the Rainy Day Fund (Executive Order 15-18) and transferred to the General Revenue fund, based on his statutory ability, \$60 Million to pay state obligations during the switch from one fiscal year (FY2018) to the next (FY2019).
